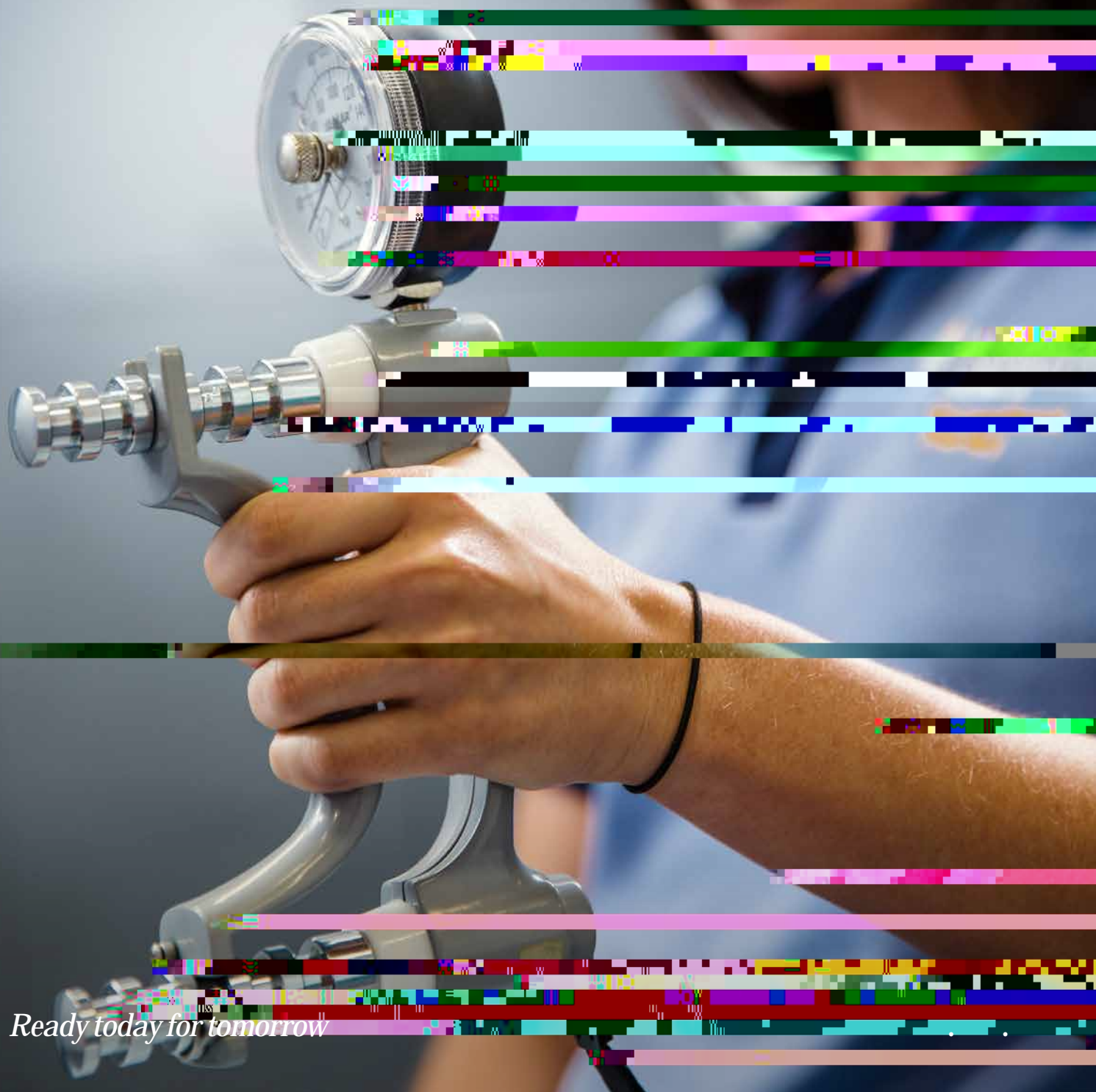

# Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours)

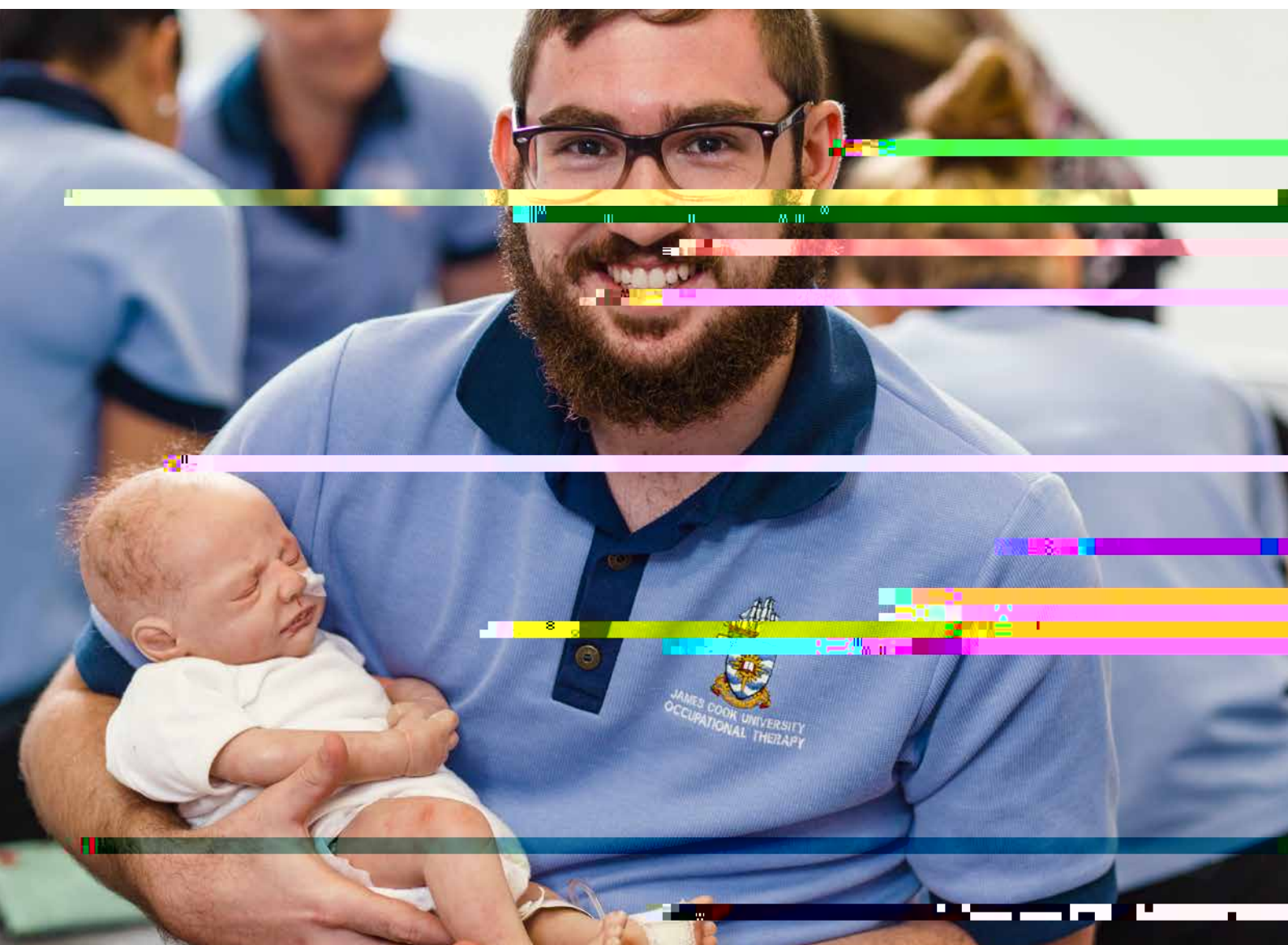

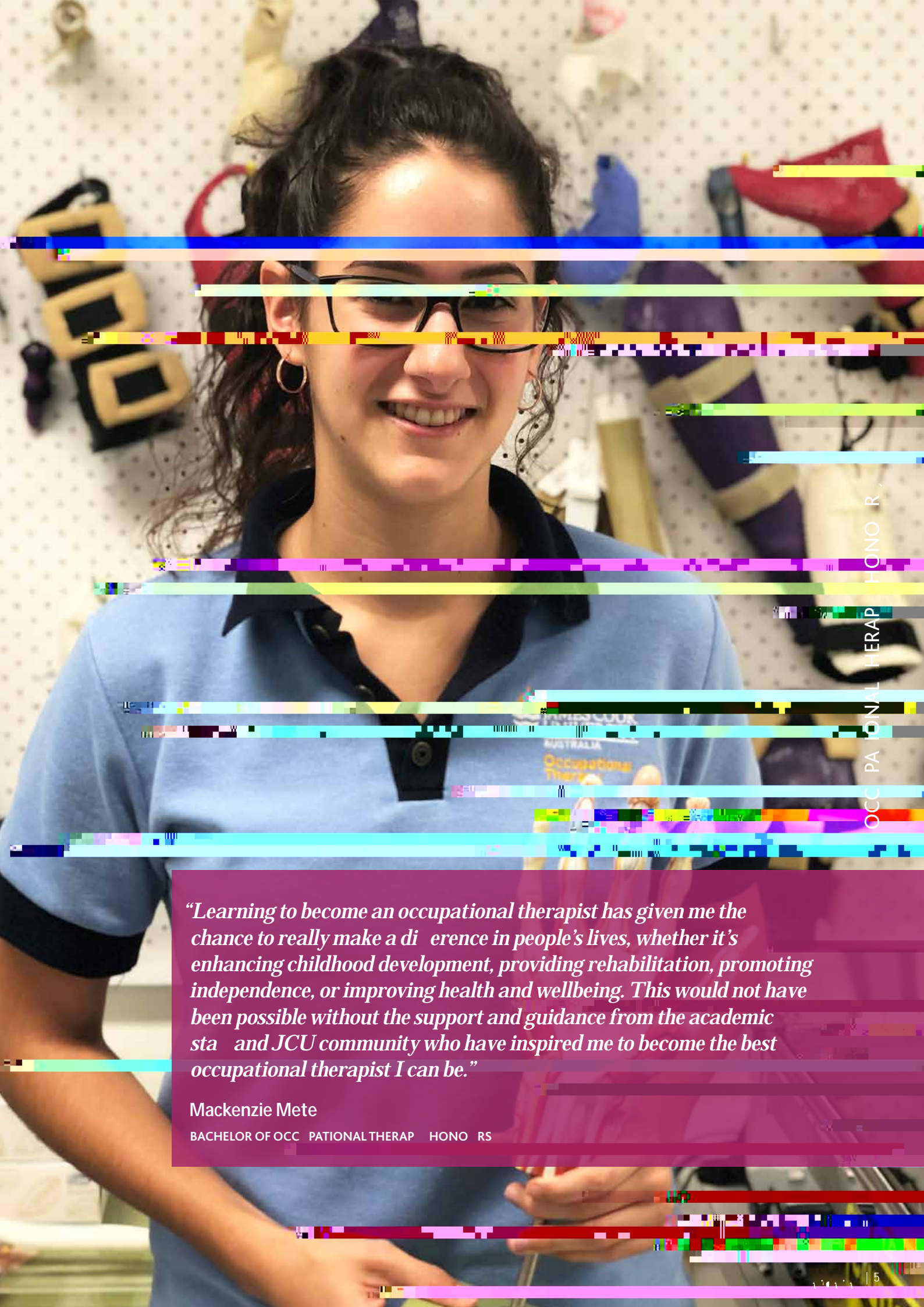

## Career Opportunities

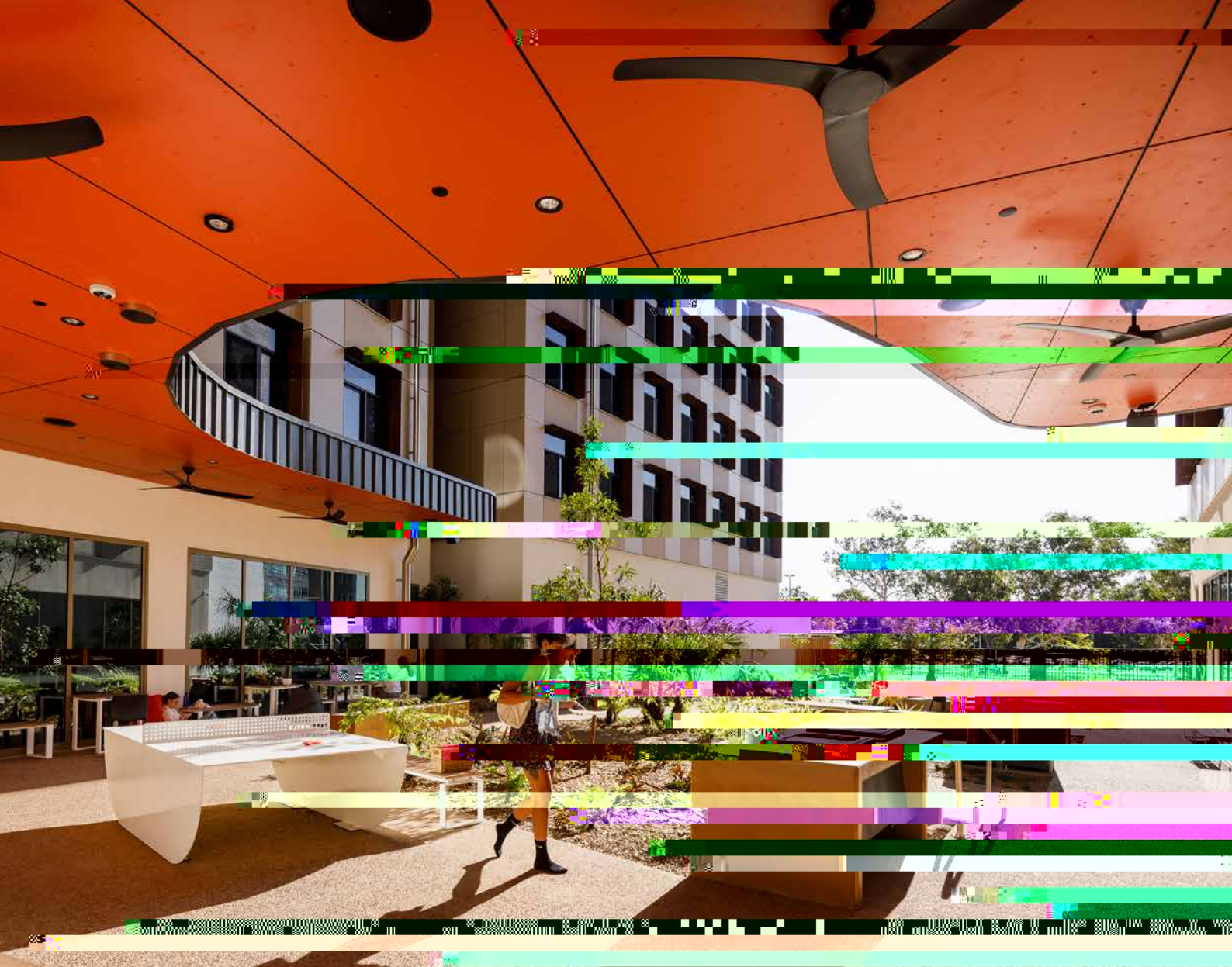
JCU Occupational Therapy (Honours) graduates have meaningful and rewarding careers providing essential services in communities throughout Australia.
